

With what should I approach the LORD and bow down before God on high? Should I come before him with entirely burned offerings, with year-old calves? Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams, with many torrents of oil? Should I give my oldest child for my crime; the fruit of my body for the sin of my spirit? He has told you, human one, what is good and what the LORD requires from

you: to do justice, embrace faithful love, and walk humbly with your God.

--Micah 6:6-8

In the Scripture above, the prophet Micah is pondering exactly what it is that God requires of us. The time and place that Micah is asking this question happens to be filled with dishonesty, corruption, and injustice. The leaders of the people had gotten so wrapped up in making themselves look better and enriching themselves over caring for the people they were supposed to be serving. They were building up a mightily beautiful city, but it was all just window dressing, hiding the ugliness that was inside. According to him, Jerusalem was going to fall because all of this building up and beautification was done on the backs of, and at the expense of, the people that these leaders were supposed to be serving. There was corruption in the government and cheating in the markets. Basically, everything was favoring the wealthy and the influential. He told the people that, if things were not changed, then destruction was in their future.

His first reaction, of course, is to go to the traditions of old. They are familiar and inviting and do not require anything new of him. They also don't require him to change at all. He simply has to follow the instructions and check off the list of the things he should bring and all is good. A cascade of calves? Check! Rations of rams and oodles of oil? Check and check! Let the child suffer for the sins of the father? Check! Basically, so long as he has something to give in atonement, he doesn't have anything to worry about. This is the attitude that a lot of people took back then and, in some ways, an attitude that carries through to our modern times as well.

Micah decides to take a different approach, though, and answers his own question by looking at things not through human eyes, but through the eyes, the vision, of God. And his answer is one that, quite frankly, makes us uncomfortable. Because gone are the days of atonement by things or faithfulness by merchandising. It requires a change from within. It requires a change of heart and mind, not just pocket and wallet.

God doesn't require things like being able to quite the Bible from start to finish or prescribing to a singular set of beliefs that are "the right ones" and all others are "the wrong ones". No, instead God requires that we do justice for those that are being oppressed and cast out, the poor, and those that are being threatened by positions of power. God requires that we embrace faithful love, embracing those that feel as if they are not deserving of that love and loving those around us, no matter our differences, working together for the common good of all people instead of those in places of privilege. God requires that we walk humbly with our God, never boasting in our own selves or our own accomplishments, never playing ourselves up at the expense of others, and giving glory to God for accomplishments rather than being braggadocious about ourselves.

So, we must ask ourselves, and those in power, as Micah did: Are we really doing that? And this question is not asked to shame us or to bring us down. We all miss the mark. We are all far less than perfect. But, as our founder John Wesley was fond of pointing out, we can strive for perfection. We know that we may never get there, but with God's help and that amazing grace that has been given to us, we can grow in our justice-doing, our faith loving, and our humbleness before God. Our faith is a verb. Our faith is not a set of beliefs on a piece of paper. Our faith is something we live; something that encourages us to live our lives with the kind of love that humbly walks with God, that seeks out justice, and that extends kindness to all. This is what God requires of us.

The only question that remains then is: Will we do that which is required?

ONE CHURCH COUNCIL 1/19/2017

ATTENDANCE: Darryl Pannier, Sue Batchelor, Frank Batchelor, Alex Niswonger, Linda Dedert, Mandy Niswonger, Linda Goodman, Lavonna Biddle, Bryan Schaefer, Fred Leist, Julie Wilson, Ron Wilson, Judy Reilly, Ann Smith, and Clara Engelman.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Darryl Pannier at 6:05 PM. Pastor Bryan opened the meeting with prayer.

The **LEARNING** time was filled by the district superintendent, Rev. Fred Leist. He came to talk about the future direction of Maple Church. He noted that most of the full-time pastors serve churches of about 125 attendees or more. Maple has been on the watch list for some time. The bishop is aware of the struggles that Maple has had with attendance and money. If we had a less than full time pastor (3/4 or ½) then it would be a local pastor. He indicated that there are about 5 new local pastors in our area who would be able to fill this opening. He indicated, however there is no part-time to pastoral care. Pastoral care is full time for any appointment. There are expectations and guidelines for pastors, full or part-time outlined by the cabinet. The cabinet will support us if we decide to go full time or part-time. We would be able to go back to fulltime any time we are in better shape. We are not guaranteed that our current pastor would remain for another year if we stayed full time. When asked about apportionments, Rev. Leist reported that the conference frowns on discussions about apportionments. Right now, they are not frowning on Maple. Maple should be a missional-based church. Rev. Leist reported that he needs to know within the next two weeks whether Maple wants to remain full time or wants to go part-time. If we do not make a part-time decision this year we may come to a point where the cabinet will appoint us a part-time pastor. The appointment year runs from July through June of the next year. Darryl promised the DS that we would have a decision to him by 2/1/2017. Rev. Leist had paperwork that would show pastoral report and what we would be responsible for 3/4 time and for 1/2 time pastors. Darryl will have copies prepared to pass out to all who want one on Sunday. If you have a less than full time pastor that would be a local pastor not retired or an elder. Our average attendance for 2016 was 89.2 (Sunday morning worship plus Wired Wednesday worship). There will be a special meeting on this issue on 1/30/2017 at 6:00PM in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone will be invited to express their opinions.

REPORTING: The minutes of the previous meeting were published in the January newsletter. Ruth Ellen made a motion that the minutes be approved as published. Frank seconded and motion carried. The Calendar was reviewed and corrections or additions made. Ruth Ellen provided reports from the new treasurer, Becky Hann and from the Special Giving fund. This report was as of 12/31/16. Memorial Fund \$793.25; Lifeline \$598.00; Office Equipment \$1200.00; Office purchases \$100.00; Shawl Ministry \$193.11; FMSC \$193.11; Fish Fry \$202.00; Blessings basket \$702.48; Bereaved Dinner \$580.14. The report by treasurer will be published in the February newsletter. Julie made a motion to accept the treasurer's and special giving reports. Mandy seconded. Motion carried. There was no report for Finance or PPR. Trustees: there was a leak in the ceiling in front of the bathrooms in the sanctuary.

VISIONING: The pastor did not have anything pressing. NOW had no report except that we have a scheduled meeting on 1/24 to plan the next several months. There was no old or new business. There were reminders about the Maple Shoppe and the Fish Fry this month. The next meeting will be the one on 1/30 at 6:00 PM and the next One Council regular meeting will be 3/16 at 6:00 PM, both in the Fellowship Hall. Mandy made a motion that the meeting adjourn and Alex seconded. Meeting adjourned.


