It is hard to believe August has already come to an end. For many September marks the end of summer and the beginning of autumn. As the days begin to shorten, we may find ourselves busier as we try to take advantage of the cooler weather and the upcoming events. Maple is no exception:

- Each Sunday, we have Sunday School Classes starting a 9:00 AM for all age groups. Sunday Church Service starts at 10:15 AM, and we provide Children's Church and Nursery Care during the service.
- Every Wednesday evening, we have a dinner at 6:00 followed by Wired Wednesday Service at 7:00.
- September 9<sup>th</sup> is the Men's Club Breakfast. The men fix eggs, sausage, biscuits, and homemade gravy, and it begins at 7:30 AM.

Many of these seeds will be shipped to third world countries, where it makes a difference between people having food or starving to death.
- September 29<sup>th</sup> is our Fish Fry. We will be serving from 4:00 to 7:00 pm. This is a time of good food, fellowship, and enjoyment. So, mark your calendars, be sure to attend, and bring some friends to these special events!

Maple also offers plenty of areas for service. John 4:35-38 says, *"Do you not say, 'There are still four months and then comes the harvest'? Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white for harvest! **And he who reaps receives wages, and gathers fruit for eternal life, that both he who sows and he who reaps may rejoice together.** For in this the saying is true: 'One sows and another reaps.' I sent you to reap that for which you have not labored; others have labored, and you have entered into their labors."* (NKJV) Have you ever noticed how many places, organizations and people offer services that allow others to benefit and enjoy a better life? What would happen if all those places, organizations and hardworking people would just stop serving? What if everybody said, "I'm not going to serve; you serve me." What if all the businesses, restaurants, churches and other facilities closed? # ONE CHURCH COUNCIL

**MEETING CALLED ON  
AUGUST 27TH, 2017**

ATTENDANCE: Darryl Pannier, Sue Batchelor, Linda Dedert, Linda Goodman, Rhonda Campbell, Lavonna Biddle, Dick Biddle, Frank Batchelor, Alex Niswonger, Terry Biddle, Sue Crites, Ruth Ellen Holdman, and Pastor Jeff Estes.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Daryl Pannier at 11:37 AM. This was a called meeting to discuss three things requested by Pastor Jeff.

The first was to inform the council that Angela Dunavan had submitted her resignation as children's coordinator for Maple Church. She and her family will be leaving Maple, and her last date of work will be 10/22/17. Darryl noted that we need to work during the next couple of months. Frank suggested that we might be able to talk with Sonja about taking over the position and have one of the congregation take over when there is someone needing care in the nursery. She would need some training in how to present lessons and to help plan those lessons. Sue B also suggested a month at a time much as we do with worship leaders or ushers. More discussion will ensue at the September 21<sup>st</sup> regular meeting.

Pastor Jeff noted that the second thing was that we will have charge conference at Centenary Church at 2:00 pm on November 5<sup>th</sup>. The finance, trustees, and PPR will be receiving forms that will need to be completed in the packet for Charge conference. If not received then they need to see Pastor Jeff as he has all on his computer. A checklist month by month was provided on getting ready for the charge conference and the end of the year.

Frank brought up that new upgrades need to be made to all the tech systems in Maple Church. It was suggested by Pastor Jeff that we work toward obtaining a grant from the Methodist Foundation. Frank made a motion that Maple pursue upgrading our entire system by obtaining a grant. Terry seconded it. Linda Dedert will write the grant but she needs the details of all the equipment needed. The grant must be submitted before October 1<sup>st</sup>. Alex will contact Mike Seals and they will compile needed information for Linda.

Frank indicated that he had received a test from the treasurer this morning that she needs \$3,500 to pay upcoming bills minus today's offering. Terry could estimate offering at \$1,500 to \$1,900. Frank made the motion to take \$4,000 from Fish Fry money and put in general budget. Ruth Ellen seconded. Motion carried. Lavonna made a motion to adjourn and Alex seconded and motion carried.

The Prayer Group has been meeting and utilizing a book with John Wesley's thoughts on prayer. It has been a revealing book. **Reminder that if you don't ask God, God cannot answer your prayer.** Please pray the following prayer for our first responders (especially in light of Hurricane Harvey):

*Blessed are you, Lord, God of mercy, who through your Son gave us a marvelous example of charity and the great commandment to love one another. **MAPLE KIDS MINISTRY:** NOW has discussed the possibility of a group camp night at the Eagle Sky campground this Fall for youth in our area that belong to small congregations. **OUTREACH:** In July, we collected school supplies for Central Middle School. What an awesome job you did. We filled one corner of the school office. It was a happy day for all involved. Thanks to all who participated.

We are *still* collecting pairs of shoes. This is for the **SHOEMAN MINISTRY**.

The group working with **HOPE SEEDS MINISTRY** meets the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month from 10:30 AM to 1:30 PM packing seeds. We meet in the Fellowship Hall and have fun, fellowship and a light meal for lunch. On August 15<sup>th</sup>, we packaged 1,800 seed packets. Pastor Jeff was able to join us as well. We have such a good time.

We will be working with **CHRISTMAS SHOEBOXES** in October.

We will also be working with PROJECT ANGEL TREE again this year and we have asked for 15 children. Please be ready to pick your angel sometime in November.

**FISH PANTRY:** We are still collecting foodstuffs for the Fish Pantry. Thanks to everyone who brought food. We do not have a count yet for August.

Pastor Jeff suggested that we plan at least three activities that we ask folks in the community to our church to enjoy fellowship time together. Suggestions from the NOW committee included concert and light snacks, movie and popcorn night, a fall harvest get together. There will be more in October's newsletter. We have also scheduled Darla McFadden to sing at the church on September 10 during our worship service. A free will offering will be taken. Another concert is planned but no dates have been discussed. Hopefully we will have this in next month's newsletter.

There will be a "yard" sale on October 7<sup>th</sup> in the Fellowship Hall. This money will be utilized by Maple Church for missions or other projects. We hope that the church will support us on this as **we need your unwanted goods**. We cannot take anything at the church until Saturday September 30<sup>th</sup> due to the Fish Fry on 29<sup>th</sup> and the cleaning crew on Saturday. Please help us. We will not be pricing anything but will have a donation jar. This is also outreach for those who need items and cannot afford. Very few people do not give us anything. Reminder this is outreach with the possibility of making some money.

**WITNESS:** Dave Schaffner will have a 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday service at the Chateau Girardeau on October 29<sup>th</sup>. He needs you to help him by showing up. Mark your calendar.
